
that we could host Rosemary West this year. We truly had a wonderful seminar.

SDP Update

Did you know that there are free ePatterns available to you as an SDP Member? What about discounts for paint, brushes and supplies? Follow the steps below to check it out.

- 1. Go to www.decorativepainters.org.
- 2. There is a **Black Banner** with many different areas listed that you can access. Just click on the area name. Some areas are for members only and may require you to sign in.
- 3. To SIGN IN:
 - Click on MEMBERSHIP.
 - Go to: Member Login Sign In.
 - Username: Enter your eMail address.
 - Password: Enter your password or use "Forgot Password" to set one up.
 - If you have never signed in, you may need to use the "Create a New Account."
- 4. After signing in, the Black Banner will show up again.
 - This time, click on "EDUCATIONAL LIBRARY."
 - You can click on any of the tabs (Public/ Members Only/Certification).
 - Under the Members Only tab, there are various tips, articles, lessons and FREE ePackets that you can download.

- 5. For Membership Discounts:
 - Go to the Black Banner MEMBERSHIP.
 - From the drop down under Membership, select MEMBERSHIP DISCOUNTS.
 - Click on the "View Member Discounts" tab.
 - You can either open this on screen or download for future reference.
 - Check back on occasion as they do update and add information.
- 6. Do you want to see the magazine before your paper copy arrives?
 - Go to the Black Banner and click on "MAGAZINE."
 - Click on the "Current Issue" or "Previous Issues."
