Nominating Committee Update

According to our current Bylaws, "ARTICLE XI. (11) NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

- 1. Nominations shall be made in the fall for the coming year. The Nominating Committee composed of not less than three (3) nor more than five (5) members shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the Board of Directors. The Nominating Committee shall be appointed at least two months before the meeting at which elections are held. The Nominating Committee shall prepare a slate for the election of officers and shall submit the slate to the members at least two (2) weeks prior to the meeting at which elections will be held. There shall be a provision for nominations from the floor for each office, at the meeting at which elections are held, provided that prior consent from the nominee has been obtained.
- Elections shall take place before the close of the calendar year. Officers shall be elected prior to the first of the year, and shall take office January 1 and

shall hold office until a successor is duly named. A majority vote is required to elect. If there is more than one (1) candidate for office, voting shall be by written ballot."

Board positions that will be open and need candidates are: President, 1st VP - Programs, 2nd VP - Membership, Secretary and Treasurer. Self-nominations are being accepted and contact is being made by Nominating Committee members. As stated in the bylaws, the deadline for us to present a slate is 2 weeks prior to the date the voting will occur, also known as, October 29, 2022.

Spotlight on Laurie Gesh

Laurie says, "I have been interested in art from a young age. I took what was available in high school, which wasn't a lot. After high school I was introduced to tole painting at community college. At that time it was always done in oils.

The most important thing I learned is to have good quality brushes. With that thinking, I am obsessed with brushes. They are my weakness. I have enough brushes to last three lifetimes!

I got involved in ceramics doing stoneware and porcelain. I used some of my experience in tole painting to incorporate in ceramics. I started taking classes in airbrushing and started teaching airbrushing.

I ended up buying a shop and taught for a few years. After selling the shop I started teaching art for a grade school. My love for tole painting stayed with me and I started taking classes from different artists and weekly classes from a local folk artist.

I ended up with a job that required a lot of my time and I had no time to paint. But the love and desire were still there. I read periodicals and tried to keep up with the art world. It would be more than 20 years before I would be able to get back to painting.

I lived in Oregon and my son and daughter-in-law

moved to Vegas after college where they are teachers. After several years and being a caregiver for my husband, my son convinced me to be close to family and move here. We stayed at my son's home while our house sold in Oregon. I really did not like the thought of living in the big city so we bought a house in Pahrump.

After my husband passed, I started hunting for my "tribe" and found SSTDP. It has brought me so much joy! I have definitely found my tribe!

I love working in acrylics, but I also love watercolor and pen and ink. I have done a little China painting and would love to pursue that, but it is hard to find China painting teachers and I sold my kiln.

I have several favorite designers and keep finding more. My favorites are Jamie Mills Price, Betty Caithness, Linda Sharp, Ronnie Bringle, Ellen Stamilio, Terrye French... there are so many that I like.

My favorite pastime is antiquing, estate sales, garage sales looking for treasures. I have a home full of antiques-including me!

At this time in my life I am pursuing what brings me joy, and tole painting brings me so much joy! I just want to learn as much as I can."
