Tips & Tidbits (by Peggy Harris, PaintWorks Magazine)

Never hurts to look through those archives; there is always something that can be useful! Here are some tips from Peggy Harris dating back to 2013 and 2014. These may be old hat to our more "seasoned" painters, but they may prove to be an "**ah ha**" moment for some painters.

*** Three (3) layers of base paint will allow you to remove rough edges in your painting by **lightly** scraping with an X-Acto Knife and still not go through the base color. This also works to remove unwanted smears, thin lines (such as stems) that are too thick and more. It provides you with a safety net just in case you don't always get it right the first time! (The key word here is *lightly*)


- *** When transferring a pattern to a different-size or different-shape than the original painting, always cut apart all the elements of the pattern before arranging on the new surface. Using the design as is (or just moving around as you transfer the parts of the design) seldom leads to the most pleasing composition on the new surface.
- *** Transfer paper is not meant to be used "as is" directly from the package. ALWAYS wipe the excess graphite off the back with a soft paper towel before first-time use in order to avoid harsh transfer lines and hard-to-remove smudges on your surface!
- *** For faster and better coverage of metallic colors, always undercoat first in a similar color of regular acrylic paint (gray under silver, for example). Check the coverage in strong daylight.
- *** When wiping your brush on a paper towel do it gently. Bristles should not be brushed back and forth on the paper towel. Brush gently one way leaning your brush near flat not straight up. This tip came from Marthalene.
- *** Speaking of good ways to clean or wipe water from your brush, the fabric from those t-shirts is a marvelous alternative to paper towel and is not as hard on your brush bristles as paper towel. Thanks to Sue Crump for this tip!
