SUMMER RECIPES

However, the summer months are slower without meetings in June, July and August; so, here are recipes that our members have shared. As the saying goes "Tried and true" and don't we all know that this is a good motto when it comes to cooking?!!

LAYERED SALAD (Paula Scrivner)

Lettuce Green Pepper Celery Onion Broccoli Frozen Peas

Other vegetables of your choice (optional)

Layer starting with lettuce first, then rest of vegetables. Frozen peas are last!

Spread with mayonnaise on top.

Next layer - Cheese of your choice

Last layer – Bacon (cooked, cooled and crumbled)

SANDY'S SUMMER FRUIT SALAD

- 1 large package fresh blueberries
- 1 smaller package fresh raspberries
- 1 large package seedless green grapes
- 1 tub fresh pineapple pieces (cut to smaller pieces)
- 2 cans peach pie filling

(You can add any fruit you like such as strawberries or canned mandarin oranges.)

Mix everything together EXCEPT the raspberries which will turn your salad red. Mix them in at the last minute. This can be made the night before and refrigerated.

Peach pie filling has a clear gel – you can use cherry but it will turn the other fruit in the salad red. Apple pie filling has cinnamon in it which will change the flavor.

P.S. Coconut or walnuts would be a nice addition. P.P.S. – I found the peach pie filling at Albertsons (Sandy)

Sandy also provided the following about a low sugar alternative to the Summer Salad.

"My family has loved this recipe for years but some couldn't eat it because they were diabetic. I came up with a low sugar alternative I wanted to share.

Take a jar of the Simply Fruit Jam and mix with a drained can of no-sugar-added sliced peaches. Mix well and then add fresh fruit as directed. This tastes like the original recipe without the sugar! (Ivy Davis)"

EASY PEASY SALAD (Mary Marquez, a painting friend of Kaye Singer)

- 1 16-oz bag frozen pea
- 1 12-14 oz bag coleslaw (can also be broco-slaw)
- 4 green onions chopped (optional)
- 1 cup poppy seed dressing
- 1 cup dry roasted peanuts

Mix all ingredients except the peanuts. Toss to coat with dressing. Add peanuts just before serving. Serves 6-8

This is a nice picnic idea – all ingredients can be taken in packaging keeping cool as necessary. About 5-10 minutes before putting out the food, mix the slaw and add peanuts just before putting it on the table. Total prep time 5 minutes!!
